<p>Nova Scotia Power</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NS Power requires you complete a registration phone call • NS Power will charge a \$28 connection fee for setting power up in your name • NS Power will ask for your first and last name. As well as the St., address which you are requesting power set up • If you have an “acceptable” credit score you are not required to provide a security deposit. • NS Power offers a “Security Deposit” option if you do not have an “acceptable” credit score/any credit score. The Security Deposit is negotiable with the NS Power representative you are speaking with. It might be a twomonth deposit for the typical power costs of the apartment. • “Bad credit” does not affect your ability to access power. You can not be denied a power account because of bad credit. However, the cost of the security deposit may need to be negotiated. • Try to phone NS Power 10 days before you move into the home. Sometimes there is a delay in power setup. • You can pay a NS power bill at ANY BANK, by telephone or via internet banking. The bank can walk you through the process of completing a NS Power payment.
